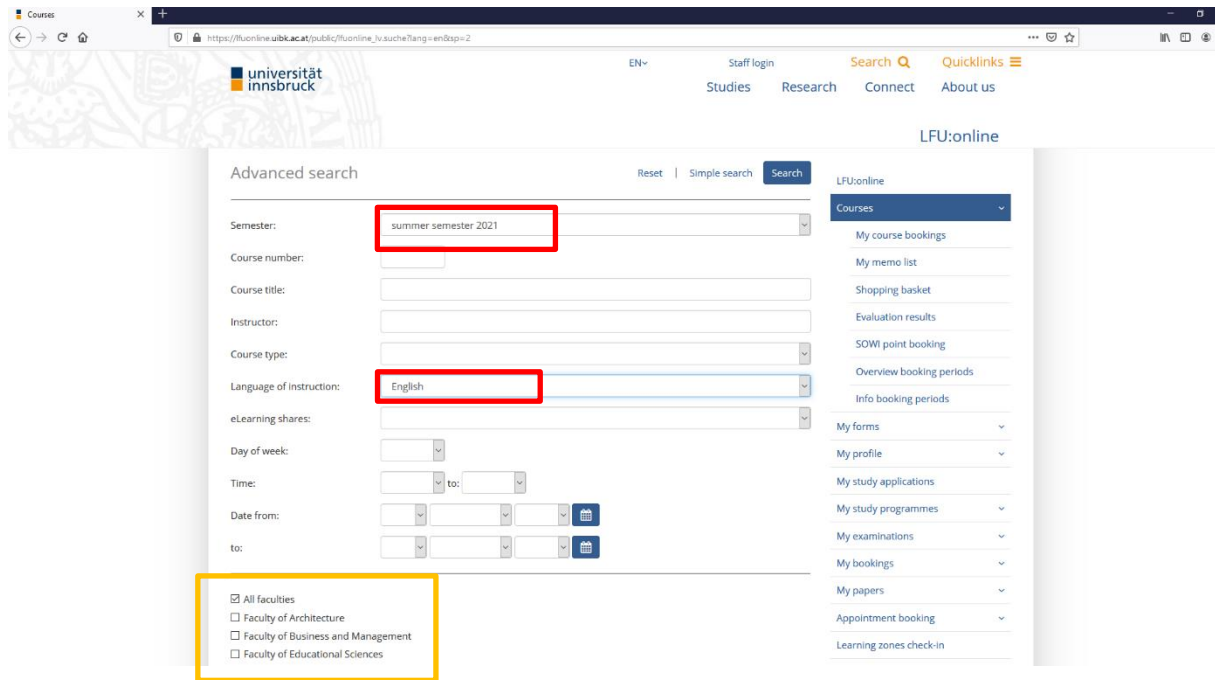

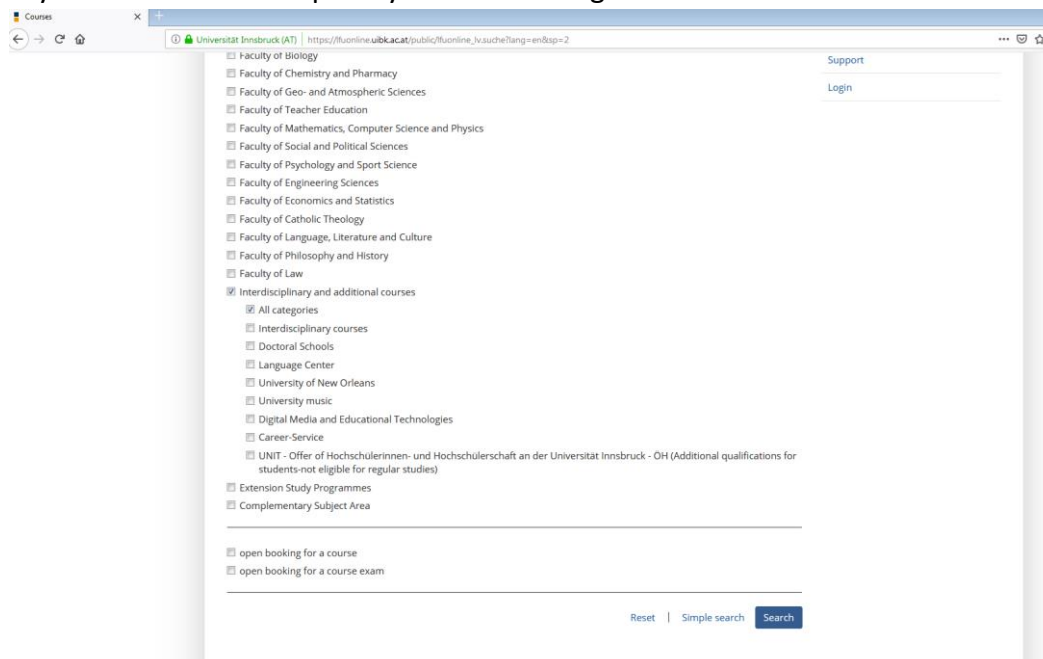

- You can choose between the current semester and past semesters. Make sure the “Language of instruction” is English. If you scroll down further, you can find the different faculties and study programmes. Choose the faculty that is of interest for you and find your equivalent Bachelor, Master or PhD program. Notice that some courses will be offered every semester, but not every course is offered each semester.



You may also want to check courses in other faculties/departments that may be of interest to you or the “Interdisciplinary course offering”!
